The idea for introducing animals at the Center of Hope began when several staff members expressed their passion for animals. The program started with Barbara the goldfish, which some of our participants enjoy seeing daily. It grew to include guinea pigs, foster kittens, and chickens.

"The best part of all of this is the fact that we are able to provide opportunities for our participants that they have not been able to experience. They are building connections with the animals and I am grateful to be a part of that," said Tammy Chandler, human resources generalist. GourMutts first started as a small craft program that provided a chance for our participants to learn a variety of skills to assist them in their daily lives as well as to help them explore employment opportunities in our community. The products were so popular that we started offering the flavored dog treats for sale in a selection of flavors.

Last summer we started working with Prairie Street Brewery to develop and distribute the dog biscuits.

"We are very excited about a collaboration with Prairie Street Brewery. This is another opportunity for employment exploration and skill development for participants attending the Center," said Pam Carey, executive director.



Tammy H. is the mother of participant, Lindsay S., who's been at the Center of Hope for 19 years. Tammy shared what it was like for Lindsay to be away from the Center during the early days of the pandemic.

"During those five-and-a-half months Lindsay was very depressed and slept a lot... she missed her friends; she missed the adults in her classroom."

"The Center of Hope provides Lindsay with a safe, compassionate, place to be. She's accepted and gets her away from the house where she can focus on herself and others, make friends, and have her own life. I honestly don't know what we would do and I don't know how Lindsay would survive or keep on keeping up where she is now, which would be really difficult."
